## Where to get your FREE **NHS** vaccine

Residents in care or nursing home for older adults



All adults aged 65 and above



Anyone aged 6 months to 64 years in a clinical risk group



Frontline health and social care workers



Anyone aged 12 to 64 years who are household contacts of people with immunosuppression



Anyone aged 16 to 64 years who are carers and staff working in care homes for older adults



Pregnant Women



# Long Term Medical Conditions include adults with:

Chronic respiratory disease, such as severe asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) or bronchitis

Chronic heart disease and vascular disease

Chronic kidney disease at stage three, four or five

Chronic liver disease

Chronic neurological disease, such as Parkinson's disease, motor neurone disease, cerebral palsy

Diabetes and other endocrine disorders

Immunosuppression

Splenic dysfunction or asplenia

Morbid obesity (BMI of 40 and above)

Severe mental illness

Younger adults in long-stay nursing and residential care settings

## Carer's eligibility

Those in receipt of a carer's allowance, or who are the main carer of an older or disabled person whose welfare may be at risk if the carer falls ill, this includes young carers aged 5-16.

# Long Term Medical Conditions



## include children with:

Chronic respiratory disease, such as severe asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) or bronchitis

Chronic heart conditions

Chronic conditions of the kidney, liver or digestive system

Chronic neurological disease, such as cerebral palsy, autism, epilepsy and muscular dystrophy, hereditary and degenerative diseases, profound and multiple learning disabilities, Down's syndrome.

Endocrine disorders including diabetes mellitus, Addison's and hypopituitary syndrome.

Immunosuppression

Splenic dysfunction or asplenia

Serious genetic abnormalities that affect a number of systems
